Burford Best in the Community

My name's Jade, I work at Witney & West Oxfordshire Foodbank. Firstly, I would just like to thank those of you who donated to us for Harvest Festival. We really appreciate the continued support and so far, this month, your donations have helped us feed 477 adults and children!

It's that time of year again where we are sending out our Reverse Advent Calendars to everyone! If you're not sure what that is, then let me tell you!

A reverse advent calendar works in the same way that a Christmas Advent calendar does, but instead of getting a chocolate or present each day, you put an item into a box that we can use in one of our food parcels, and then at the end of the 25 days, you donate the box to the Foodbank! See attached calendar for suggestions.

To get your donations to the families in need in time for Christmas, we need to receive them in good time, which is why we do the advent calendar in November instead.

Winter is the hardest time for people and families facing poverty, as they often have to choose between staying warm and buying food. Last year, from October 1st to February 28th, we fed 2460 people. That's 1421 adults and 1039 children.

Please, help us to help those in need this Christmas season, and spread the spirit of giving!
